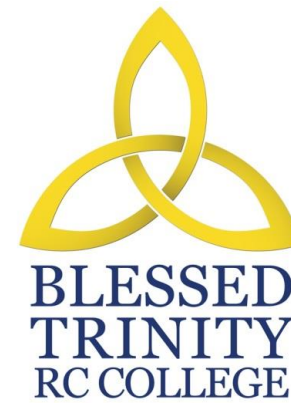

### Skills

Remember to say a few words too about how your activities and achievements show off your skills.

#### Communication (Other) Start

Good communication skills are important for any job that involves working in a team or directly with people. Examples include: a part-time customer service job in a shop or café, volunteer work in your local community, fundraising, joining a debate club or a good school report from your teacher that singles out your communication in class.

#### Communication (Written) Not Yet Started

Written communication skills are very useful in jobs where you have to produce reports, negotiate or deal with people over email. Include examples of essay subjects you study, like English and History; and extra activities, like entering writing competitions, publishing articles, or organising a petition for a cause.

#### Creativity Not Yet Started

Showing your creativity is important for jobs in Art and Design, but it also shows you can think outside the box. List any creative subjects you study, like Art or Drama; plus any competitions you have entered or courses and projects you are working on in your spare time, like a play, a blog, creative writing, music, dance, or photography.

#### Hard work & effort Not Yet Started

Whatever job you choose to do, it's important to show an employer that you are willing to work hard. Examples
