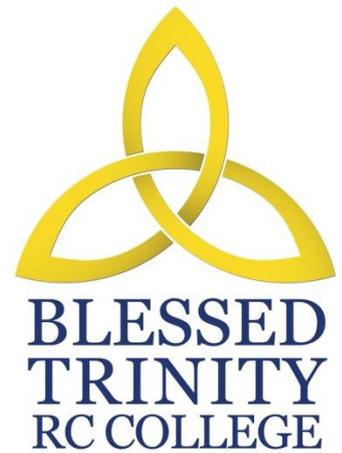

As a school community, we were shocked and saddened to hear the news regarding Ethan.
