Out and about for Geography fieldwork

The Geography Department recently took four GCSE groups out of school to complete their GCSE fieldwork.

The groups visited Innovation Drive (on Bankcroft Road) and the River Don, that runs along the nature corridor next to the business park.

The group spent the morning investigating whether or not Innovation Drive has had a positive impact on Burnley.

The pupils collected data by conducting car park surveys, environmental surveys and by questioning the business manager at Lancashire Digital Technology.

In the afternoon, groups spent time investigating whether the River Don had changed as it moved downstream.

Pupils collected data by measuring river depth, river width and river velocity. Both trips provided pupils with valuable opportunities to test some of the theories we have studied in class.

"I play either centre midfield or right back.

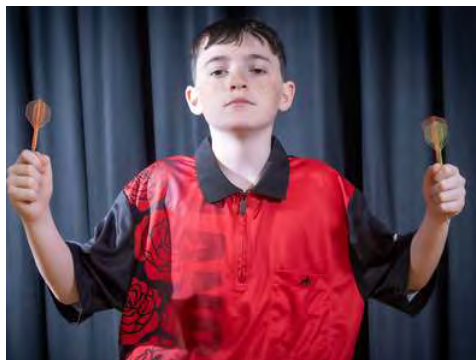
"I had trials at a couple of clubs before signing for Accrington Stanley but I enjoy it there.

"I was in total shock," said Amelia. "I was shaking! It's so much better than I expected. I thought I had messed up my maths but I got Maths and Further Maths.

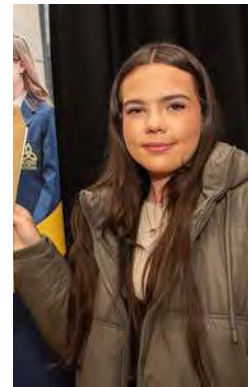
"My mum was crying when I rung her. I was so relieved as so much effort has gone into it.
